# **CONSTITUTION**

## **ARTICLE I - NAME**

The name of this body shall be Clear Creek Baptist Association.

## **ARTICLE II - AFFILIATION**

The Association shall affiliate with the Illinois Baptist State Association and the Southern Baptist Convention.

## **ARTICLE III - ARTICLES OF FAITH**

The Association shall subscribe to the *Baptist Faith and Message* adopted by the Southern Baptist Convention on May 9, 1963.

## **ARTICLE IV - MISSION**

The Mission of Clear Creek Baptist Association is encouraging churches toward effectively fulfilling the Great Commission, equipping Christian leaders, and inspiring cooperation among God's people.

## **ARTICLE V - MEMBERSHIP**

Section 1. The Association is composed of Baptist Churches who wish to cooperate in carrying out the Mission of the Association and are in harmony with the purpose and spirit of the *Baptist Faith and Message*. Member churches shall annually submit Church Profile reports to the Association and are encouraged to be represented by Messengers to Annual Meetings and membership in the Board of the Association.

Section 2. Membership in the Association shall be purely voluntary. The Association shall not exercise any authority over the churches in respect to their doctrines or method of work; but may exercise the right to counsel and advise any church that appears to have departed from the faith and practice of the New Testament, and to withdraw fellowship from any church and refuse to recognize messengers from such church that might vary fundamentally from the teachings of the *Baptist Faith and Message*.

## **ARTICLE VI - ANNUAL MEETING**

Section 1. The Association shall meet annually in October on the date and place established by action of the Association at the previous year's meeting.

Section 2. Messengers to the Annual Meeting shall be the senior Pastors of member churches, their elected Board members, and three Messengers elected by each church. Other Messengers shall include elected Associational Officers, Committee Chairmen, and Team Leaders. Each Messenger shall have one vote.

## **ARTICLE VII - THE BOARD**

The Association shall have a Board made up of leaders of the Association charged with responsibility of carrying on the business of the Association during the interim between Annual Meetings.

## **ARTICLE VIII - PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE**

Parliamentary proceedings of the Association shall be guided by *Robert's Rules of Order*, latest revision.

## **ARTICLE IX - OFFICERS**

The Officers of the Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, and Trustees. The Executive Director shall be an *ex officio* Officer of the Association serving as the primary executive and administrative officer. This function shall be performed in consultation with the Moderator and the Board. All shall be members of churches affiliated with the Association.

## **ARTICLE X - ORGANIZATION**

Section 1. To fulfill its mission and assist member churches effectively, the Association shall provide organizational leaders. Team leaders will provide motivation and training by promoting and publicizing all associational, state, and denominational meetings, activities, and projects. Team leaders may enlist others to assist them in accomplishing their work. Teams may include those designed to provide assistance in Sunday School, Discipleship, Music, Men's Missions and Ministries, Women's Missions and Ministries, Pastoral Ministries, Youth Ministries, Prayer Ministries, Church Planting Ministries, Disaster Relief Ministries, Volunteer Missions, Hospitality, and others as may be deemed needed by the Association or the Board. Each Team shall be led by an elected Associational Team Leader.

Section 2. Active committees are essential to the effective functioning of the Association. The Association currently has four standing committees: Personnel, Finance, Nominating, and Operations Committees. Other committees may be added or those no longer serving a purpose may be deleted by action of the Association or the Board.

## **ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS**

All proposed amendments to the Constitution shall be submitted in writing to the Operations Committee. Recommended amendments shall be presented at two consecutive annual meetings, the first for reading only, and the second for discussion and vote. A two-thirds majority of the messengers voting is required to amend the Constitution.

## **BY-LAWS OF THE CONSTITUTION**

These By-laws of the Constitution are designed to assist the leaders in carrying out their responsibilities in directing the internal affairs of the Association. They apply to the various Articles of the Constitution needing such procedural guidelines. The Sections are in the same sequence and the headings coincide with the Articles of the same name.

### **SECTION A - MEMBERSHIP**

1. A church seeking membership in the Association shall forward a petitionary letter to the Operations Committee at least sixty days before the Annual Meeting of the Association. Attached to the letter should be the Church's Annual Church Profile form completed for a twelve-month period, a copy of the Articles of Faith, and a copy of the Church's Constitution & By-laws adopted by the Church.

2. The Operations Committee shall review the request and make any further investigation they deem necessary or desirable. Based on their findings, the Committee shall make a recommendation to the Association during a business session of the Annual Meeting. A three-fourths majority of the messengers voting shall be required for admission.

3. If a church fails to file an Annual Church Profile form for three consecutive years, it shall be considered as having withdrawn from the Association. Upon a vote of the Association, the church will be dropped from membership.

4. In the event any member church in practice appears to violate the Articles of Faith adopted by the Association, the Operations Committee will investigate. If a violation is found, an attempt will be made to bring about reconciliation. Failing in this, the Committee will make appropriate recommendations to the Association during its Annual Meeting. Withdrawal of fellowship will require a two-thirds majority of the messengers voting.

### **SECTION B - THE BOARD**

1. The Board shall be called the Executive Board and shall be composed of the senior Pastors of member churches, one elected Executive Board Member from each church, the Associational Moderator and all Associational Officers, Team Leaders, and standing Committee Chairmen along with the Executive Director and regular staff members.

2. The Executive Board is responsible for the work of the Association during the interim between Annual Meetings. They shall meet three times a year. The regular dates shall be established by the Associational Calendar after approval at the Annual Meeting. The Moderator may call a special meeting by notifying all members of the Executive Board at least a week before the meeting date. Fifteen members will be required for a quorum to conduct business. The Board shall present a full report to the Association during the Annual Meeting.

3. The Executive Board shall also be responsible for employing the Executive Director and other staff members, establishing terms of employment, and termination of their services. In the event the Executive Director position is vacant, the Board shall elect a special Search Committee of seven members selected from the Executive Board. This committee shall be comprised of individuals from seven different churches, and include at least one female member, as well as one layperson. Working with the Executive Board, they shall establish desired criteria. They shall then seek candidates, interview, and make recommendations to the Executive Board.

4. Executive Board Members elected to represent affiliated churches should keep their respective churches informed of actions and goals of the Board. In the event a member church loses representation through resignation or death, a new Board Member should be elected to fill the vacancy.

## SECTION C - OFFICERS

Except for filling vacancies, all officers shall be elected during the Annual Meeting after nominations are made by the Nominating Committee. A majority vote of messengers voting is required for election. Each officer of the Association shall deliver all items that pertain to his office to his successor upon completion of his duties. \*

\* Where masculine gender is used, it is considered as generic and may apply to male or female members.

The following duties, terms of office, and method of election apply to the officers indicated:

1. The **Moderator** shall preside over the Annual Meeting and meetings of the Executive Board. He will work closely with the Executive Director and shall be an *ex officio* member of all committees. The Moderator shall be elected annually and may not serve more than two successive full terms. After a recommendation from the Nominating Committee and an opportunity for nominations from the floor, he shall be elected during the Annual Meeting.

When the office of Executive Director is vacant and his time permits, the Moderator shall give leadership and counsel to the staff, leadership team and association as needed. In case of the resignation or death of the Moderator before the end of his term, the Assistant Moderator automatically shall become the Moderator and the Executive Board shall elect another as Assistant Moderator.

2. After a recommendation from the Nominating Committee and an opportunity for nominations from the floor, an **Assistant Moderator** shall be elected annually during the Annual Meeting. He shall perform all of the duties of the Moderator in his absence or at his request.

3. The **Clerk** shall make and keep a complete and accurate record of the proceedings of the Association in Annual Session, Special Sessions, and Executive Board meetings. The Clerk will make these available to all cooperating churches through the Associational office. Such records are Associational property and shall be filed in the Associational office.

In the absence of both the Moderator and the Assistant Moderator, the Clerk shall call the meeting to order and preside over the election of a Moderator *pro tem* who shall conduct the meeting. In the absence of the Clerk, the Assistant Clerk shall assume the above duties.

4. The **Treasurer** shall receive all monies belonging to the Association, deposit them in a bank designated by the Association, and maintain accurate records of all receipts, their source and purposes for which they were contributed. Monies shall be disbursed by the Treasurer according to the authorizations of the Association or the Executive Board. No special authorization will be necessary for payment of bills presented by Departments or Committees that do not exceed the amounts appropriated for their use.

The Treasurer shall apprise the Executive Board of the status of the treasury at each of their meetings and make a full report to the Association at the Annual Meeting.

In the absence of the Treasurer, the Assistant Treasurer shall assume the above duties.

The Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer shall be bonded or have other equivalent insurance with the Association assuming the expense.

5. Three **Trustees** from three different churches shall be elected to serve three-year terms on a rotating basis, one being elected each year. A Trustee having served two terms or a major part thereof shall be ineligible for reelection until at least one year has elapsed.

The trustees shall have general oversight of all physical properties including the acquisition and disposal of office equipment. They are charged with responsibility for signing all legal documents.

They shall have no power to mortgage or transfer any property without specific authorization by the Association or the Executive Board. Other specific responsibilities are outlined in the Policies and Procedures Manual.

## SECTION D - ORGANIZATION

Team Leaders shall be elected by the Executive Board at the Annual Meeting after recommendations of the Nominating Committee. They shall assume their one-year terms of office immediately following their election. Their specific duties are outlined in the Role Descriptions in the Policies and Procedures Manual.

The Associational Moderator, Annual Meeting host pastor, Association Music Team Leader, Executive Director, and two at-large members appointed by the Moderator shall prepare a program for the Annual Meeting and recommend the preachers and alternates. The team shall also recommend the places, dates, and times for the Annual Meetings for the next two years. Following the adoption of the Program at the opening of the first session, the Moderator is responsible for conducting the meeting as scheduled. Committees are essential to the smooth functioning of the Association. No two members of any committee may be from the same church.

1. The **Nominating Committee** shall consist of three members serving three-year terms. A member may not succeed himself. The Moderator shall appoint persons to fill each vacancy and new term.

The Committee's responsibility is to select members for nomination at the next Annual Meeting to fill the offices of Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Trustees, Team Leaders, Committee Members other than the Nominating Committee, and other nominations as may be referred to it by the Association or Executive Board. During the year the committee will make nominations to the Executive Board to fill any vacancies that may arise. The Committee shall obtain consent of all nominees before placing their names in nomination.

2. The **Personnel Committee** shall consist of three members serving three-year terms with one being elected each year. A member may not succeed himself.

Personnel Committee responsibilities include recommending personnel policies and procedures to the Executive Board and developing and maintaining role descriptions for each paid staff position. This committee shall also cooperate with the Executive Director to receive applications for support staff positions, interview applicants, and make recommendations for employment to the Executive Board.

The committee should evaluate the work of the Executive Director annually and review his evaluation of other staff members. The Personnel Committee will annually make budget recommendations for staff salary and benefits to the Finance Committee. If the need should arise, the Personnel Committee, in consultation with the Executive Director, has responsibility for recommending termination of any staff member to the Executive Board.

3. The **Finance Committee** shall consist of five members, one of whom is the Treasurer who will serve as Chairman. Other than the Treasurer, members shall be elected for four-year terms with one being elected each year. A member may not succeed himself.

It shall be the responsibility of the Committee to prepare a proposed annual budget for review by the Executive Board before the Annual Meeting. The Committee shall present the final draft at the Annual Meeting for consideration of the Association.

4. The **Operations Committee** shall consist of three members serving three-year terms with one being elected each year. A member may not succeed himself.

The Operations Committee is responsible for studying the Constitution and Bylaws to determine needs for changes. Upon their initiative or instruction of the Executive Board, they will prepare suitable amendments and present them to the Association for consideration at the Annual Meeting. Committee members should also make themselves available for consultation regarding whether Association procedures are in accordance with the Constitution and Bylaws.

The Operations Committee is also responsible for reviewing membership status in the Association as outlined in Section A-Membership of these Bylaws. Additionally, the Operations Committee is responsible for preparing and recommending appropriate resolutions to the Association for recognizing all services rendered by individuals, groups, and churches during the Annual Meeting. They may prepare position statement resolutions on regional issues bearing upon the spiritual well being of the Association and the Nation. Suggestions for any resolutions should be presented to the Committee in draft form not later than the first session of the Annual Meeting.

## **SECTION E - LEADERSHIP TEAM**

The **Leadership Team** shall be composed of Team Leaders, Officers, and others as deemed necessary by the Leadership Team Leader. The Executive Director shall serve as the Team Leader for the Leadership Team.

The Advisory Team shall be composed of the Kingdom Builders Team Leader, Church Strengthening Team Leader, Administrative Team Leader, and Executive Director. The Executive Director shall serve as the Team Leader for the Advisory Team. The Advisory Team shall act as counsel for the Executive Director. Any authority given to the Advisory Team will be printed in the Policies and Procedures Manual.

## **SECTION F- AMENDMENTS TO THE BYLAWS**

Any proposed amendments to the By-Laws shall be submitted in writing to the Operations Committee. Recommended amendments shall be read at an early session of any Annual Meeting of the Association but shall not be voted upon until a later session. A two-thirds majority of the messengers voting is required to amend the By-Laws.

10. Treasurer Nancy Ralls moved to accept the 2011 Treasurers Report as printed. The motion carried.
11. Terry Kern, representing the Operations Team, moved the following resolution be approved, "whereas Anna First Baptist Church has extended their hand of fellowship by serving with love and kindness and whereas they have provided meals, child care, leadership in worship and the use of their facilities, now therefore be it resolved that the Clear Creek Baptist Association extend its thanks and appreciation to the members of Anna First Baptist Church and Pastor Les Sinks and staff for their hospitality and the use of their facilities. Be it resolved that the Association extend its thanks and appreciation to members of Caledonia Community Church and Pastor John Windings for their hospitality and assistance." The motion that the resolution be approved carried.
12. Operations Team Chairman, Terry Kern, read a Constitution Amendment recommendation to be voted on at the 2012 CCBA Annual Meeting.
13. Representing the Operations Team, Terry Kern made the following motion, "upon the unanimous vote of the Operations Team and Harvest Church to proceed, and upon Harvest's agreement with the Baptist Faith & Message and desire to partner with us in our endeavors on behalf of the kingdom of God, the Operations Team moves that the Clear Creek Baptist Association receive Harvest Church as an association member church." Terry took roll call of all board members and messengers. Paper ballots were handed to each voting member present. The Operations Team counted the votes during the duration of the first session with the result to be read in second session.
14. Representing the Trustees, Dan Miller moved to create a fund honoring Rev. Verlee Eaker that will help pastors and leaders with leadership development, calling it the Eaker Leadership Development Fun and to accept designated contributions for the fund. The motion carried.

15. Roger Ferrell and Helen Head presented a certificate to Verlee Eaker.
16. An offering was taken for the new Eaker Leadership Development Fund.
17. Roger Ferrell led in prayer and the meeting was adjourned for a meal provided by Anna First Baptist Church and a ministries fair with several ministries represented.

21. Moderator Roath appointed Mark Kirk (Sandy Creek) as a member of the Nominating Committee. He appointed Denny Kilmer (Cobden First) and Russ Kreuter (Fellowship) to the Annual Meeting Planning Team.
22. Roger Ferrell, representing the Leadership Team, presented the 2012 calendar of events as printed in the Book of Reports and moved to accept the 2012 calendar of events. The motion carried.
23. In miscellaneous business, Terry Kern, representing the Operations Team, reported that the Harvest vote was 77% yes with the motion carrying.

## **EXECUTIVE BOARD**

### **Mark Roath, Moderator**

Following is a summary of the actions of the Executive Board from January 2011 through September 2011.

#### **January 11, 2011**

The written record of the September Executive Board meeting was approved as printed and the motion to accept the financial report for the months of September – December carried.

Dudley Kesler, representing the Leadership Team, moved to recommend a mission trip to Owsley County Food Pantry in Booneville, KY the week of July 25, 2011, to partner with The View in Carbondale, IL and limiting the number of participants outside the association to attend. The motion carried.

Treasurer Nancy Ralls presented the 2010 calendar year budget report. Nancy moved to accept the report. Motion carried.

Nancy, representing the Leadership Team, moved to allow Roger to meet with the Finance Committee to find \$3000 in the budget to support SIHOP and Bob Eval. Motion carried.

Terry Kern, representing the Operations Committee, read the following motion; "The CCBA Operations Committee met January 4, 2011. Roger Ferrell, Larry Schramka and Gene Hart were present. Given that we are actively starting new churches and seeking partnership with like-minded and like-doctrine churches in the area, and by request of the Leadership Team, the Operations Committee unanimously agreed to develop a Watchcare program for churches who apply for membership with CCBA. This program would apply to church plants, new churches, existing churches coming from other associations or denominations and unaffiliated churches who apply for membership in CCBA and have not yet been approved by messengers at our Annual Meeting. Watchcare would provide a template for accountability, fellowship, the sharing of information and expectations and an official relationship between CCBA and her churches and the requesting church. The Operations Committee requests approval to develop documents for the program and begin implementation in the spring of 2011." Motion carried.

Carl Dillow, representing the Nominating Committee, moved to add Todd Plunkett as Prayer Coordinator. Motion carried.

Mark Roath, representing the Leadership Team, moved to allow the \$6000 set aside for a new Anna Church Plant be made available to the church planting team to allocate these funds to a new church called The Bridge. After much discussion and agreement that these funds be held accountable by a church planting team, the motion carried with opposition of two no votes.

#### **May 10, 2011**

The written record of the January Executive Board meeting was approved as printed and the motion to accept the financial report for the months of January – April 2011 carried.

Treasurer Nancy Ralls, representing the Financial Committee, moved to accept a 2011 amended budget to allow funds to help with SIHOP (Southern Illinois Hispanic Outreach Project). The funds had been paid out of the Kingdom Builders Earnings and now will be paid out of the General Fund. The motion carried.

## **EXECUTIVE BOARD, CON'T**

Dan Miller, representing the Trustees, moved to allow Pregnancy Matters (PM) the use of the Clear Creek Baptist Association building two days a week. PM would use the library portion of our building as a reception area and to store resources to give away to those who need them. They would also use the counseling office for crisis counseling. They would give a small financial gift every month to CCBA to help with utilities and other costs. PM would begin meeting here in June, with our partnership evaluated quarterly by our Executive Director and Trustees. The motion carried.

Terry Kern, representing the Operations Committee, gave a report to the Board that the Watchcare documents had been completed and given to two churches.

### **September 20, 2011**

The written record of the May Executive Board meeting was approved as printed and the motion to accept the financial report for the months of May – August 2011 carried.

Treasurer Nancy Ralls presented the Proposed 2012 Budget for information only.

E. D. Roger Ferrell handed out church planting documents for board members to review for possible church plants by Ken Wilson in Carterville, Daniel Money in Vienna and Roger Ferrell's house church. Roger, representing the Leadership Team and the Church Planting Team, moved to approve and provide funding of \$6000.00 for a church start in Carterville, led by Ken Wilson, with the funds coming from the Kingdom Builders Fund. Motion carried. Roger, representing the Leadership Team and the Church Planting Team, moved to approve and provide funding of \$6000.00 for a church start in Vienna, led by Daniel Money, with the funds coming from the Kingdom Builders Fund. Roger then spoke about the house church, Noel he started in his home and the reasons behind the new work. He stated that Noel was not seeking funding, only approval. Mark Roath, representing the Leadership Team and the Church Planting Team, moved to approve Noel as a new work. The motion carried.

E. D. Roger Ferrell spoke about the trip that he, Mark Roath, Todd Plunkett and Robbie Ralls took to Canada. He mentioned that Peter Blackaby asked Clear Creek to adopt the area of Southwestern Ontario, strategize how to plant churches there and then add them to our association. There will be a covenant or documents in writing with the CBNC outlining the responsibilities of both parties. Every move would use CCBA polity. Roger, representing the Leadership Team, recommended proceeding with caution to partner with the Canadian National Baptist Convention to start churches in the Southwestern Ontario area. The motion carried.

Mission Volunteers Leader, Dudley Kesler, proposed a three-year commitment to Owsley County Food Place in Booneville, Kentucky for mission trips having spent the first year in 2011. Terry Mejean moved to accept the proposed three-year commitment to Owsley County Food Place in Booneville, Kentucky. Russ Kreuter seconded the motion. The motion carried.

## EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

### Roger Ferrell

Look among the nations, and see; wonder and be astounded. For I am doing a work in your days that you would not believe if told." Habakkuk 1:5

It has been a tremendous joy and privilege to serve my second year as your Director of Missions. In both my life and my work, as friends and partners in ministry, you have been such a blessing. In the past year, God has given us much favor, is helping us work through many challenges, and is changing us in marvelous ways that we might be for His glory. I set 3 goals back in January to give focus and shape to my ministry for 2011 so let me share with you what God has done in each of these areas.

First, I set out *to welcome or plant partnering churches into CCBA and strengthen the Body of Christ in southern Illinois*. God has strengthened and increased the fruitfulness of many of our churches this year. Caledonia reorganized for more effectiveness, Cobden started 10 new small groups in homes, Mill Creek finished their Fellowship Hall and Big Creek will have theirs done in just a few more weeks. Many churches have reported great revivals and successful VBS weeks and though there is not room here to report all the good news from the churches, there are many testimonies of God's grace! I am also glad to report that our church plants, by and large, are doing very well, as seen in our detailed Church Planting Team report in this document. This year we also developed a Watchcare document for those churches who are interested in affiliating with Clear Creek and as I write this, we have one church, Harvest Church, under Watchcare and partnering very well with us and two more considering this process. On a sad note, Ware Baptist Church closed earlier this year, but even in this, we have cause for rejoicing. I am glad to report that most of the members there have joined other churches in our association and are doing well there. Ware church graciously gave away their resources to other churches including Mound City First and Harbor and the proceeds of their building and land to the Baptist Children's Home and Family Services and Disaster Relief. But when God closes some doors, He opens others. In an amazing turn of events, we were asked by the Canadian National Baptist Convention back in May to consider adopting southwestern Ontario as part of our association and planting a network of churches there. After two trips there and much discussion and prayer, our Executive Board has approved this direction and we are moving forward, with FBC Jonesboro and Anna Heights and new church Noel already committed to work in this area and many folks expressing an interest in going there on mission.

Second, I pledged *to invest in pastors and missional leaders for their joy, the building up of the church, and God's glory*. It has been such a joy to meet with so many of our pastors, potential pastors and other leaders in our churches this year. God is doing a work in us as disciplemakers as we learn together how to equip the saints for the work of the gospel. Our pastor's network continues monthly. We also led two Basic Training Journey events in partnership with IBSA to train new church planters and started a Church Planting Network for the southern Illinois region. And with a gift of \$10,000, we have established the Eaker Fund for Leadership Development to help provide training for pastors and leaders in the church. We will take an offering for this fund every year at CCOM. It was also a great joy to spend a week in Ontario in September with three of our pastors encouraging one another and praying and planning about expanding our ministry there.

## EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT, CON'T

Third, I planned *to equip and encourage churches to share the gospel and make disciples, here and around the world.* But I could not plan for the flood that hit us last spring. And I could not plan for our churches to step up and help one another and help stricken communities, but I am glad to say they did, and did the Kingdom proud. Whether it was Anna First or Fellowship feeding displaced people or Harvest renovating the flooded sanctuary at Lake Milligan, our churches served together and served one another in a wonderful way. And that continued throughout the year. We had record attendance at our men's events, continued the vital work of WMU, hosted mission groups who served among us, and traveled to Mexico, Canada, Kentucky, Haiti, India and other countries to share the gospel. We began work on the Cairo Missions Center, and many churches built bunk beds to provide a place for mission groups to stay and serve in Cairo and the surrounding area by next summer. We hosted not only one, but two Disciplemaking Church conferences and trained over 75 people in intentional disciplemaking.

There have been many other blessings in my work this year. We continued our bible study for young adults and finished studying the book of Acts together. I was able to worship and preach in many of our churches and be part of mission trips to Canada and Kentucky. God allowed us to take what we have been learning about disciplemaking and plant a new kind of church in our home this fall. And He increased our borders to include southwestern Ontario. There is much work before us and so I appreciate your partnership and your prayers going forward. I am grateful and glad to be on mission with you for the glory of God.

*But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. 1 John 1:7*

## CHURCH PLANTING

Why plant new churches? We get asked this questions periodically, and there are some very good answers. First, church planting is one of the most effective evangelism tools under heaven. When churches get planted, people get saved. The historical and statistical proof of that compels us to plant new churches to reach the lost with the gospel. But church planting also helps existing churches think more of the kingdom, trains new leaders, reaches out to unreached people groups, provides an environment for innovation, and mobilizes people on mission. It had been thirty years since we had last planted a church in our area, and so, last year, our Executive Board unanimously approved starting 5 new churches and funding them through our Kingdom Builders Fund in the amount of \$6000 each. This year, we have approved four new churches. Here are reports from the new churches:



Harbor Church was started in the Lake of Egypt community, which has 9,000 people and just a handful of churches. David Thompson came to serve as their pastor this summer. David writes: "We have acquired a building across from the Lake of Egypt fire department and have been renovating it. Our average attendance has gone from 25 to 40 since we've been there and we've had first time guests almost every Sunday. We've had several events over the last few months with new guests at each one and have another big outreach at the end of the month. We are finalizing our membership guidebook so that we can have a membership class and establish a membership the Sunday following that class. We will be establishing a church-wide outreach ministry shortly after the membership gets established. We anticipate starting small groups and a women's ministry in the near future. Our priority and goal right now is to get our membership established. Things are going VERY well at Harbor church.



**Southern**  
Illinois University  
**Carbondale**

The new church plant in Carbondale is centered around Southern Illinois University and is meeting in a home on Sunday nights with 9-15 participants weekly. Chase Abner, who directs the BCM at SIU Carbondale, is our point person for this new church. Chase shares: "Our core group continues to meet each Sunday for prayer, Biblical teaching, worship in song, the Lord's Supper and a meal. We are all seeking to share Christ through our everyday routines, praying the Lord will grant a harvest. We currently have four families in our core group and have celebrated the births of two babies in the past six months! Please pray for us as we finalize our membership covenant & church constitution and prepare for next steps in our journey. To God be the glory!"



El Sembrador (The Sower) is a multi-site Hispanic church reaching into the Steelville, Murphysboro, Carbondale, and Cobden communities. Robert Cruz leads this dynamic and challenging ministry. This year, many of our churches have plugged in to start a new migrant ministry and to help with outreach to Hispanic families. The Sower now has an office in Carbondale, an advisory board, and a board of

elders. And God has given them great success in seeing many come to Christ. Please continue to pray and support this great church.



As we continue to pray for God to send a pastor/planter for Cairo, our churches have united to build the Cairo Mission Center there inside Cairo First Southern Baptist Church. This facility will be finished by next summer and have space to lodge and feed mission teams up to 25 people. Please pray for outreach efforts in Cairo and for a church planter/pastor to be called to the huge mission waiting there.



The Bridge Church started early this year to reach out to the community around the Cape Girardeau – Illinois bridge. They have about 25 people meeting for worship and small groups in homes. Pastor Terry Mejean says that ministries like Financial Peace University are meeting needs and providing hope to this struggling community and also providing a bridge to the Gospel. Please pray for The Bridge Church.



In September, we approved 3 church plants. One of them, SI Country Church, is led by Pastor Ken Wilson. Ken says: “We are working on developing the core group and the leadership over the next two months and build off them with evangelism and outreach. We’ll be having a Bible study in homes up until our official launch to build our core and start ourselves off strong. Our launch service is planned to be sometime late winter/early spring, depending on

our leadership. Our kick-off service will be a wild game dinner, meant to bring a lot of guests in to see what we’re really about. The people we’re really trying to reach are outdoorsmen, sportsmen, and just good old country folks like ourselves. There’s an abundance of people that fit those categories in this area, and there’s a great need to reach them where they are. We’re planning to be located somewhere between 57 and 13 near Rt 148. We’re trusting God to lead us to the right location in His timing. We’re excited about what He is going to do in the months to come.”

## CHURCH PLANTING, con't



On Mission Church is a new church in Vienna led by Pastor Daniel Money. Daniel moved here from Memphis, TN where he led an inner-city discipling ministry and God has given him a heart to start a new church centered on one-on-one discipling. Through bible studies at the prison and conversations on the street, his desire is to see men and their families become devoted followers of Christ. Daniel

shares: "The focus of our church is in agreement with the biblical statements found in Matt. 28:18-20; Mark 16:15; Luke 24:47; John 20:21 and Acts 1:8. We are a sent people that see the masses through the man and build and equip the man to reach the masses to the ends of the earth till the end of time as we function as a body. We set our hearts to study the word and to practice it and to teach it (Ezra 7:10) and to continue to engage the local community as we seek to reach the globe. We are On Mission With HIM!"

### FINISH THE MISSION

The third new church plant we approved in September, which is not seeking funding,

is what is called an organic or simple church and is called Noel Church. This church is being planted by a team led by Roger Ferrell and Wade Dover and is the template and training ground for many of the churches we will plant in our partnership in Canada. Please pray for us as we seek to start this work that is based on a model from the International Mission Board and encourages members to open their homes to their lost friends and neighbors to share the gospel with them. We meet in homes on Sunday afternoons for worship and during the week for bible study and are already seeing God work in an amazing way.

This year we will be completing our 23rd year of existence and it seems amazing that we have been around that long to me. In January of 1989 I had a dream of starting a counseling ministry for the Southern Illinois area at affordable costs from a biblical perspective. I began the year by going to five locations each week attempting to provide counseling, if anyone would call or come in to schedule an appointment. It was certainly a struggle at first. But halfway through the first year, I was able to attend a month long counselor enrichment program that was the very first one that FOCUS ON THE FAMILY (James Dobson) ever offered. At that time he was in Pomona, California. I learned more in that month than I felt I ever learned in grad school. When I returned home I felt that the ministry might survive. Amazingly we have lasted for this length of time. Each year is a struggle but God, using support from area churches and individuals, has always pulled us through.

In 2011 we have had to raise extra money through three fundraisers, a pool tourney at David and Cheryl Gilley's home in Marion, a bowling tournament in Herrin, and a bible trivia night at Christian Covenant Fellowship in Carterville. We also have spoken in several churches for freewill offerings this past year. These all help keep us afloat, as well as some continued church support and individual gifts.

This year we are continuing to provide approximately the same services as last year. We provide a free group on Tuesday that has used Celebrate Recovery materials in the past. The group continues to be a very active therapy group with biblical principals for people struggling with hurts, habits, and hang-ups, but has moved away from just using CR materials and principles. We have several active bible studies that meet on Monday evening, Tuesday noon in Anna, Thursday morning in Marion, and Friday noon in Marion.

Counselors Judy Faulkner Dempsey, Duaine Carlton, Clarice Burchell, Cris Corzine, and I continue to provide individual, marriage, and family sessions at three different locations during the week. CCM hosts Dare to Care on WGGH radio for the 19<sup>th</sup> year. We are also in the 11<sup>th</sup> year of writing a weekly news article for the Marion Daily Republican Newspaper. Cheryl Gayer has served as the office manager for over ten years now.

As always we wish to continue to thank Second Baptist Church, Williamson County Baptist Association, and Clear Creek Baptist Association for providing us office space. We also wish to thank our board members, radio sponsors, and various others who help us in many different ways through out the year. Finally we just want to praise the Lord for the many answered prayer requests throughout the years that has allowed us to stay in business.

## **SOUTHERN ILLINOS HISPANIC OUTREACH PROJECT**

First of all I would like to thank all the churches of the Clear Creek Baptist Association for your prayers and support. The Lord continues to bless the ministry to Hispanics and your prayers make a difference. God has been good to SIHOP this year.

This is our third year training leaders through our leadership training center. This is the last year for Juan from Centralia and Gerardo from Effingham. We would have had three, but Pablo was deported back to his home town in Mexico. He chose voluntary deportation because he felt the Lord was leading him back home to plant a church in Mexico. When he returned he began a Bible study and now has new believers including his mother and father and other family members. The small group has grown into a new church plant in his home town. God is sending out harvesters into the mission field from our Bible Institute here in Illinois. Gerardo is leading Bible studies in Effingham. Juan is helping me with a Bible study we started in Albers. Many Hispanics in Breesee live very close to the new building that Faith Baptist Church just completed. We are encouraging them to go to the English services where we will have translators available for them.

Carol and I continue going weekly to the Jefferson County Jail and the Marion Federal prison. Lately the ministry in the Jefferson County Jail has become a challenge in that they have started putting ICE inmates (those that are being deported to their home countries) with local inmates. They come to the worship service together, which means we have to do the service in English and Spanish, but it seems as though the Lord always blesses. Many times we have worshiped in both languages at the same time. It is a foretaste of what it will be like when all nations and tongues will gather to worship the Lord together!

We have decisions to receive Christ in almost every service. This is exciting for us in that they will return to their home countries or their homes in Jefferson County as new creations in Christ. This year we have had the wonderful privilege of baptizing 10 inmates; including one from Russia, two from Poland, two from Mt. Vernon and the rest Hispanics.

Roberto Cruz, my son-in-law Juan Carlos, and I continue leading the weekly Hispanic Bible study in the Marion Federal Prison. This is a group of about 20 Hispanic inmates that love to praise the Lord and are hungry for His Word. This also is a challenge for us as many of the men come from different doctrinal backgrounds and have lots of questions concerning the difference in doctrinal beliefs. We have been teaching them the Baptist Faith and Message. We also preach to continue challenging their spiritual growth.

I would like to ask the association for prayer at this time. The future of SIHOP and I need your prayers in a decision that must be made. This is the last year that IBSA will be helping with funding for SIHOP. For SIHOP to continue, we will need funding to be made up from other sources. Would you consider adding SIHOP to your budget for the coming year? If SIHOP does not continue, I need the Lord to show me what His will is for my future. I have been blessed and have enjoyed being the catalytic missionary for SIHOP these past seven years and would like to continue, Lord willing.

There are still several areas where we have not reached the Hispanics. We still have new opportunities opening up, but we need to plan and be able to offer consistent programs. We can explain how your church can help start an ESL (English as a Second Language Program), assist in VBS to Hispanic Groups, and Evangelism. We have some new places that we have considered visiting as we have been informed of growing Hispanic populations still within our area.

Please prayerfully consider your part in this ministry. God bless you. Thank you for your support and prayers through these years in our local ministry.

## BAPTIST CHILDREN'S HOME AND FAMILY SERVICES

As Christians we have a Biblical mandate to care for the most vulnerable in our society: The widowed, orphaned, poor, abused, neglected and abandoned.

Our responsibility is clear. We should be caring for people with the greatest of needs, at every opportunity, knowing that the most vulnerable and needy are the recipients of divine concern. **Psalm 68:5** declares that God is “**a father to the fatherless and a defender of widows...**” If God cares about them so should we!

Baptist Children's Home and Family Services has stood in the gap for children and families in crisis for 93 years. The dream of an orphanage that began in 1918 is and now a multi faceted child welfare agency that is meeting the needs of families across IL. We provide care through Baptist Children's Home in Carmi, Angels' Cove in Mt Vernon, adoptive and foster homes throughout the state and through Pathways counseling centers in 8 cities.

In partnership with Southern Baptist churches across IL, our mission is to provide Christ centered services for children and families that protect, heal and restore. Recently our Board of Trustees voted unanimously to approve a new strategic plan that will guide the agency for the next 5 years in accomplishing this mission. The plan identified several strategic issues facing the agency: The need to continually improve the quality of existing programs while expanding services to reach an even greater number of children and families. The need to develop better marketing strategies to raise the resources to sustain current work and support planned growth. The need to protect the agency's assets in an age of litigation. The need to provide the infrastructure necessary to support the growth of the agency. The need to manage the transition of leadership staff in the next 5 years.

In light of these strategic issues the following goals were established: To expand our outpatient counseling ministry by opening a Pathways counseling office in northern IL and an additional office in central IL. To explore and develop ways to meet the educational needs of children in residential care who are unable to attend public school. To expand cottage living space in our residential care cottages, which are now over 60 years old. To better meet the needs of families in crisis and keep children out of the child welfare system by instituting a *Safe Families for Children* program. (*Safe Families* is a national movement of compassion that is working to prevent child abuse by encouraging the church to resume its historical and Biblical responsibility for vulnerable children by becoming part of the support network for families in crisis. It is a movement of hundreds of Christian families who have opened their homes to care for children whose parents are struggling. By demonstrating Biblical hospitality, *Safe Families* returns the church to the forefront of caring for "orphans and widows." To begin an orphan ministry by developing a partnership with an orphanage in Uganda to help care for children in need.

I am excited about the future of Baptist Children's Home and Family Services. God is blessing the work in amazing ways and opening doors for new ministry. Please be in prayer about as we continue to improve our current work and begin these exciting new endeavors. Maybe in 2012 you will become one of our new *Safe Families* or travel with me to Uganda to work in the Bukaleba Babies' Home. I look forward to seeing what God is going to do.
